Hosts about 70 people detained who work primarily with the land and animals.

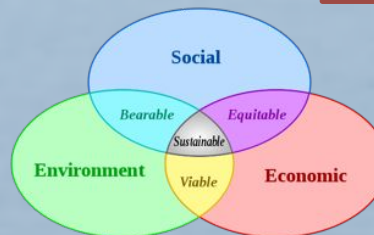
